
OXFORD CASTLE AT 050

We have been pleased to work in partnership with Oxford University Department of Geography and Urban Bio-Labs which brings academics and the public together to learn about plant growth at urban heritage sites including the Castle Mound.



Good planning, sustainability and active travel contribute to the health and well being of us all

The OPT Planning Committee visited Old Marston and the three sites taken out of the Green Belt. With two permissions granted and a third in the wings, things have moved quickly, and in the rush to build these 400 homes the City Council have

been prepared to accept the reliance on cars. The poor active travel plans that accompany the developments will do little to encourage cycling and walking.

In the city centre discussions on the emerging plans for the new Humanities building make promises of an outward focus and engagement with the community. Our hope is that the ROQ site can begin to feel more like a piece of the city and less of a university

campus, on a site which was historically part of the town and means a great deal to local people.

At the southern edge in Oxpens an innovation district with a commercial focus is being discussed on a site which could, more easily than most, deliver zero carbon, zero cars and a new sustainable way of living with the infrastructure in the city centre so close at hand.

Elsewhere we are asking the District Councils to join together to produce a strategy for solar farms which are coming forward thick and fast. We are keen to support green energy but want to see a way of comparing the

merits of the five sites that have come forward so far, and to take account of the visual impact and loss of green space for local communities.

PT have been working in partnership to promote the NHS Health Walks and the Sustainable Healthcare - Oxford's Green Health Routes and have our own range of Heritage & Green Spaces self-guided walks which include our new initiative working with the Rose Hill Communities.

OPT Green Awards 2021





Learn more of the fascinating history of Rose Hill with local historian Liz Woolley.


